There will be presentations at 11 am and 2 pm by Dr. Kathleen Lyons, Dept. of Paleobiology at the Smithsonian.



Sure there are some probably missing, but these I have found through the years. It's strange that I haven't come across a White Shark. but they were suppressed by the Megalodon. Not until the extinction of these giants, did White Sharks become more abundant.

The I. hastalis, Mako sharks, from Little Hatchet look narrower than elsewhere in the State. Some are probably lateral (side) teeth, but surely not all of them. The absence of Sand Tigers, Carcharhias sp. is another mystery. Could be the environment at that time was not to their liking.

It's still always thrilling for me to find sharks' teeth wherever I can... when I can.

In November, for the Kids' Fossil Blast and into the regular meeting, "Sharks" will be the theme. Bring in your sharks' teeth to show off. I'll be bringing a "little" of my personal collection, and we'll talk sharks, along with other business.
