# Kids' Fossil Blast

Our August Kids' Fossil Blast was messy but fun. We explored the nature of land masses and plate tectonics with play-doh and oil to act as magma.



The next program will be on Saturday, Nov. 15th at 2 pm. We'll check out horse fossils and their 50 million year evolution in North America.

Kids' Fossil Blast is an informal hands-on experience with real fossils and casts aimed at kids ages 5 through 13.

## Speaker at FFH Meeting Saturday, Sept. 20th

Our speaker at this month's meeting will be Felipe Opazo, PhD.

His presentation will be: Ecology, energy and complexity throughout the Phanerozoic: roles of mass extinctions. Which basically describe how the number of species has increased thought the life history, and with it, how the biological interaction between species has increases generating more complex ecosystems, and how this dynamic has been modulated by the mass extinctions.

Dr. Luis-Felipe Opazo, Marine Biologist is from Chile and this is what he says about himself -


I got my PhD in Geoscience in 2012 in University of Plymouth, UK. The subject of my thesis focused on paleoecological changes in marine invertebrate communities during the Triassic-Jurassic mass extinction event. Afterward in 2013, I moved to Gainesville to work as Post-Poctoral Fellowship in Invertebrate Paleontology, at The Florida Museum of Natural History. In general my research interest spans; palaeontology, paleobiology, ecology, paleoecology, macroevolution, global change, mass extinction, ecological modelling, statistics and quantitative analysis in biodiversity. Currently I'm working in two projects; Evolution, energetic and distribution of body size in Bivalves and Brachiopods: A comparative analysis of marine Palaeozoic and Mesozoic faunas, and Metabolic rates and species replacement during Pliocene-Pleistocene extinction event: Scaling up of ecological patterns and processes in the fossil record. In both cases, I describe and evaluate large-scale ecological changes of marine fauna in term of energy use, which will allow us to understand, how the distribution of energy and nutrients determines the replacement dynamics between species in paleocommunities, or how ecological competition might scale up to the level of long-term paleontological patterns.

#### **PEACE RIVER**

It might be high again by the time you read this, but for now the Peace River is flirting with 5 ft at the Zolfo Station. That means that until it gets some more rain, it's possible to dig and sift in the river. Hope you



get there during this brief hiatis in the weather. Remember to save some fossils for the Kids' Dig Pit. Checking the river height before your next trip via the link on our website: floridafossilhunters.com


